Backed by the Good Returns guarantee, Miles of Freedom participated in ORIX Corporation USA's recent Cycle.

At the conclusion of the December 2019 Cycle, ORIX Foundation honored Miles of Freedom with a \$105,000 End of Year Giving grant. The grant was funded largely by ORIX employees who learned about Miles of Freedom at work.

The story of the Cycle helped build a powerful relationship between Miles of Freedom and ORIX, with catalytic loan capital, support grants, and crucial business resources that are helping Miles of Freedom fulfill its mission of healing the effects of incarceration on individuals, families, and communities.
